

NON-COMPLIANT GLAZING: THE COSTS ARE MOUNTING

Non-Compliant Glazing is rapidly developing a reputation for costing Building Owners and Operators significant sums in damages arising from Legal Actions.

The introduction on the standard ASI288, the selection and installation of glass in buildings, represents an excellent opportunity to review the **safety & fitness for purpose** of your buildings. This is particularly relevant for areas such as doors, low level windows, wet areas, stairways, mirrors, balustrades and roof glazing.

For instance, just because your building was glazed prior to the introduction of the standard does not excuse it from being safe or fit for purpose.

Further, the existence of a building permit does not necessarily mean that your building complies with the current Standard or that you can be said to have properly fulfilled your duty of care.

To protect yourself, you should consider asking your accredited glazier to ascertain the compliance or otherwise of your buildings.

The Glass Industry has sponsored the implementation of AGGA accredited glaziers, glaziers who have demonstrated through study and examinatation, the ability to correctly apply the requirements of the new standard.
